## **(II) INTRODUCTION**

In accordance with Order No. 28-23-OD of 15.02.2023 of the Director General of the Independent Accreditation and Rating Agency, from 06 to 07 April 2023, an external expert commission assessed the compliance of the educational program 6B01705-Russian language and Literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction of the Non-Profit Joint-Stock Company Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin (Arkalyk) standards of specialized accreditation of educational programs of higher and (or) postgraduate education (Republic of Kazakhstan) of the Independent Accreditation and Rating Agency (No. 57-20-OD dated June 16, 2020, sixth edition).

The report of the External Expert Commission (EEC) contains an assessment of the submitted educational programs to the criteria of the IAAR standards, recommendations of the EEC for further improvement of educational programs, and parameters of the profile of educational programs.

## **(III) REPRESENTATION OF AN EDUCATIONAL ORGANIZATION**

Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin (ArkPI) has been implementing higher education programs since April 1972.

The Republican state enterprise on the right of economic management "Arkalyk State Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin" of the Ministry of Education and Science of the Republic of Kazakhstan operated on the basis of the Charter approved by Order No. 743 of the State Property and Privatization Committee of the Ministry of Finance of the Republic of Kazakhstan dated August 07, 2012.

Since October 11, 2019, by Decree of the Government of the Republic of Kazakhstan No. 752 "On certain issues of higher educational institutions of the Ministry of Education and Science of the Republic of Kazakhstan", ArkSPI has been transformed into a non-profit joint-stock company "Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin" with 100% state participation in the authorized capital.

The mission of the Institute is to train teachers capable of high professional and personal achievements.

The Institute's vision is a) a consolidating center that generates innovative ideas and new knowledge at the regional and national levels; b) a center for interaction, exchange and implementation of international programs in the field of education.

The strategic goal of the Institute is to become a leader and enter the top 5 best universities that train teachers in the Republic of Kazakhstan.

The Institute's values are Kazakhstan's patriotism, integrity, openness, academic freedom, professionalism, and global citizenship.

State license No. KZ45LAA00018500 dated July 28 2020 was reissued by the Committee for Quality Assurance in the Field of Education and Science of the Republic of Kazakhstan in 7 areas of training areas of education 6B01 Pedagogical sciences: Pedagogy and psychology, Pedagogy of preschool education and training, Training of teachers without subject specialization, Training of teachers with subject specialization of general development, Training of teachers in natural science subjects, Training of teachers in humanities subjects, Training of teachers in languages and literature.

Training of personnel in 29 educational programs of higher education (bachelor's degree) is carried out in accordance with the Law of the Republic of Kazakhstan "On Education", the Bologna Declaration and other documents in the field of education on the basis of general secondary education, technical and vocational education and higher education in the state, Russian, and English languages. A Bachelor's degree is awarded to a Bachelor of Education graduate in the relevant educational programs.

In 2018, the Institute passed specialized accreditation for 19 educational programs, and in 2021 it passed institutional accreditation (Independent Agency for Accreditation and Rating).

In the National Rating (IAAR, 2018), it takes the 16th place. 6 educational programs were included in the TOP 10 (IAAR rating, 2019).

The structure of ArcPI includes 3 faculties: the Faculty of Pedagogy and Philology, the Faculty of History and Art, and the Faculty of Natural Science and Informatization. The university has a Department for Academic Affairs, an Office for Academic Programs and Methodological Work, a Registrar's Office, a practice and employment sector, an office for science, strategic planning and international relations, an educational work department, a Rukhani Zhangyru project office, research laboratories, educational laboratories, and the I. Altynsarin Museum of the History of education, trade union committee, psychological and pedagogical complex, preschool mini-center "Baldyrgan", information and library complex, multi-service educational complex, museum of the history of education named after Ybrai Altynsarin, Museum of Natural History, etc.

Educational work at the Institute is presented as a holistic and versatile complex activity. The structural division of the Institute in the system of management and coordination of educational activities is the Department of Educational Work, established in 2011, and there is a Council of curators. Student self-government at ArkPI includes a holistic mechanism that allows students to participate in the management of the institute and in the organization of their life activities through interacting structural divisions of student self-government: the city branch of

the Alliance of Students of Kazakhstan, the youth wing "Zhas Otan", the pedagogical team "Line of Success", the student trade union committee, the Student Council of the House of Students, creative associations, sports sections.

Students of the Institute are multiple winners and prize-winners of regional, national and international tournaments, university games in various sports, world, European and Asian championships.

The university's infrastructure includes 2 academic buildings, the total area of buildings, according to the available technical data sheets, is 12076 m<sup>2</sup>, a sports and recreation complex with 5 specialized halls, computer and multimedia classrooms, interactive lecture halls, a canteen, a medical center, two student houses for 468 seats. All buildings of the Institute comply with sanitary standards and fire safety requirements.

#### **(IV) REPRESENTATION OF AN EDUCATIONAL ORGANIZATION**

Non-profit Joint-Stock Company "Arkalyk State Institute named after I. Altynsarin" has been operating since April 12, 1972 in accordance with Resolution No. 220 of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Kazakhstan and the Council of Ministers of the Kazakh SSR.

B NAO "Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin" trains personnel in 30 bachelor's degree programs (<https://api.edu.kz/index.php/ru/applicant/specialities>) on the basis of the state license to engage in educational activities No. KZ45LAA00018500 dated 28.07.2020.

The Institute operates on the basis of:

Altynsarin, approved by the order of the Chairman of the State Property and Privatization Committee of the Ministry of Finance of the Republic of Kazakhstan No. 326 dated 28.05.2020, registered by the Department of Justice of Kostanay region No. 990240005309 dated 30.06.2020;
- Strategic development plan of NJSC "Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin" for 2022-2025;
- Academic policy of NJSC "Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin";

The Institute has a mission, vision, strategic goal, and values that guide its educational activities. Adjustments, additions and updates are made in accordance with changes in the external and internal environment, as well as taking into account new legislative and other regulatory legal acts and policy documents adopted in the field of education and science.

The mission of the Institute is to train teachers capable of high professional and personal achievements.

Vision: An innovative regional scientific and educational hub that trains teachers.

Strategic goal: To train professionals who translate innovative pedagogical ideas.

Values: Kazakhstan's patriotism, integrity, openness, academic freedom, professionalism, global citizenship (<https://api.edu.kz/index.php/ru/common/mission>).

The academic divisions of the Institute include 3 faculties: the Faculty of Natural Sciences and Informatization, the Faculty of Pedagogy and Pedagogy, the Faculty of History and Art, 10 departments, the Department of Academic Affairs, the office of academic programs and methodological work, the registrar office, the practice and employment sector, the Office of Science, Strategic Planning and International Relations, and the Department of Educational Policy. project office "Rukhani zhangyru", research laboratories, educational laboratories, Museum of the history of education named after I. Altynsarin, trade union committee.

The number of undergraduate students is 2,534, of which 1,041 are full-time students and 1,493 are part-time students.

The infrastructure of ArkPI includes: 2 academic buildings, 2 student houses, an information and integrated library, stationary practice bases in Koktal, 10 computer classes, 2 robotics classrooms, mobile computer classes, 7 training workshops, a Polycom VSX 7000 video conferencing system, a sports and wellness complex, a sports and wellness camp, 12 multimedia complexes, 7 educational centers, a sports center, a training center, a training center, a training center, a training center, a training center, multimedia classrooms, the I. Altynsarin Museum and the Natural History Museum.

## **(V) DESCRIPTION OF THE PREVIOUS ACCREDITATION PROCEDURE**

In February 2018, the educational programs "Russian Language and Literature" and "Russian Language and Literature in schools with a Non-Russian language of instruction" of the Arkalyk State Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin were specially accredited by the NAAR.

During the course of accreditation, the IAAR Commission developed recommendations for improving educational programs. Based on the recommendations received, a plan has been drawn up to implement the recommendations of the IAAR EEC. All the recommendations of the IAAR were successfully implemented to improve educational programs.

The measures and actions taken contributed to improving the quality of the educational process, creating conditions that contribute to the formation of the personality of a student of the EP.

## **(VI) DESCRIPTION OF THE EC SESSION**

The visit of an external expert commission to NJSC «the Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin» was organized in accordance with the program agreed in advance with the Chairman of the Management Board – Rector of the Institute and approved by the Director of the Independent Agency for Accreditation and Rating.

In order to coordinate the work of the EEC, a preliminary meeting of the EEC was held on 05.04.2023, during which powers were distributed among the commission members, the schedule of the visit was clarified, and agreement was reached on the choice of examination methods.

EEC meetings with target groups were held in accordance with the program of the visit, in compliance with the established time. During the visit, conversations were held with students and teachers of the university, graduates and employers.

Members of the EEC also attended a class on the discipline "Phonetics, lexicology and phraseology of the modern Russian language" (teacher - master B.N. Turgumbekova). Topic: "Archaisms, historicisms, neologisms" (1st year).

Updating of the acquired knowledge was carried out in the form of an oral message from students, Google forms test questions. In the course of the lesson, various tasks were performed aimed at consolidating students' theoretical knowledge of the topic: research analysis of the text, participation in a quiz, drawing up dialogues using neologisms.

The events planned within the framework of the visit to the Institute of Higher Education provided experts with a detailed introduction to the Institute's educational infrastructure, material and technical resources, faculty, representatives of employers' organizations, students and graduates, which allowed for an independent assessment of the compliance of the data set out in the self-assessment reports of the Institute's educational programs with the criteria of the standards of specialized accreditation of the Institute.

A survey of teaching staff and students was conducted.

As part of the planned program, recommendations for improving the university's performance, developed by the EEC based on the results of the expert examination, were presented at a meeting with the management on April 07, 2023.

## **(VII) COMPLIANCE WITH SPECIALIZED ACCREDITATION STANDARDS**

### *7.1. Educational Program Management Standard*

#### ***Proof part***

The activities of ArkPI are regulated by certain regulatory documents of national, regional and intra-university significance. The latter include the "Academic Policy" approved by the Academic Council of the University (dated August 26, 2020, Protocol No. 1 (with amendments and additions dated August 31, 2022, Protocol No. 1)). It is developed on the basis of the current legislation of the Republic of Kazakhstan in the field of education, normative legal acts of the Ministry of Science and Higher Education.

The existence of documented procedures for all aspects of the university's activities ensures their interrelation. Such important components of the university's activities as teaching, training, and research are subordinated to a single strategic goal of the functioning of the Arctic Research Institute and represent the implementation of the tasks of such development.

"Regulations on the quality assessment of educational programs at the Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin", "Regulations on the educational program and the procedure for its development at the Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin" determine the design and implementation of educational programs.

The objectives of the EP are formulated taking into account the requirements and requests of potential consumers, based on the assessment of the demand for EP, which is determined by the interests of employers, the potential of the university, the requirements of the state and society as a whole.

The quality assurance policy is defined by the regulation "Internal Quality Assurance Policy of Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin".

Plans for the development of accredited educational institutions are developed on the basis of the university's Strategic Development Plan for 2022-2025, mission, and department



development plan. EP development plans contain key performance indicators.

The Institute actively engages representatives of interested parties in the management of educational programs. Employers, teaching staff, and students are invited to attend meetings of collegial management bodies, and monitor the implementation of decisions taken. When representatives of interested parties are included in academic committees, basic education and the content of professional activities are taken into account.

EP management is transparent: students have access to information about internal regulations, rules for organizing the educational process, the procedure for paying for training, the contract for providing educational services, CED, EMCD, etc.

In order to increase competitiveness, such activities as analyzing the demand for and competitiveness of graduates and expanding the academic environment around the institute are developed and implemented.

In general, there is a systematic approach to the management of implemented educational programs, which is reflected in the creation of the necessary collegial bodies to monitor the quality of content.

#### ***Analytical part***

The EEC confirms that the university's management has demonstrated its openness and accessibility to students, teaching staff, and employers.

Analysis of the university's website showed that information about educational programs is publicly available on the site for all interested parties. The content of educational programs reflects national development priorities and corresponds to the university's development strategy.

Planned changes in the content of the OP are discussed at meetings of the department with the involvement of employers and students. The content of the EP in general and each discipline in particular is compiled with the participation of all interested parties. Annual surveys of principals and experienced methodologists of secondary schools of the city are conducted in order to take into account opinions when developing and updating the EP.

So, for example, for those accredited by the EP, the senior teacher of the department, Master A.E. Ibragim, developed and introduced the discipline "Theory and Practice of Onomastics" into the Catalog of elective disciplines (minutes of the department meeting No. 5 dated 05.12.18). Also, the component for choosing basic disciplines includes the author's courses of Candidate of Pedagogical Sciences, Associate Professor Z.Sh. Koldasbayeva "Theory and practice of a communicative-activity approach to teaching the Russian language in a secondary school" (minutes of the meeting of the department No. 9 dated 03.04.19).

#### ***Strengths/best practices***

No strengths were identified.

#### ***Recommendations of the EEC for improving the quality of EP 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction:***

- in the description of accredited EP, present their uniqueness with a mandatory focus on the specifics of the region and the national component until June 2023;

- to build research priorities in the context of the implemented EP, to activate the research activities of teaching staff of accredited programs, to systematically implement the results of research in the educational process until 2025;

- determine the mechanism for managing innovations and implementing innovative proposals in the framework of educational programs 6B01702-Russian language and literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction until September 2023.

#### ***EEC conclusions on criteria: According to the Standard "Educational program***

*management", accredited educational programs have 16 satisfactory positions and 1-suggest improvement.*

## 7.2. Information Management and Reporting Standard

### **Proof part**

ArckPI provides regular collection, analysis and monitoring of information in order to effectively manage the educational process and ensure the quality of educational services provided.

The university has created and successfully operates a unified system for collecting, analyzing and managing information flows: 1) internal information flow - between structural divisions implementing the EP and administrative and managerial divisions, between teaching staff and students, 2) external information flow – between structural divisions implementing the EP and consumers – the department of education of the region, districts, secondary schools, colleges, parents of students, etc.

The main way to access Internet resources is to connect users of the corporate network to the institute's proxy server. This server allows you to provide access to users (employees, teachers, students) based on corporate usernames and passwords. All interested parties participate in the process of collecting information through monitoring activities (questionnaires, access to the website, posting information in social networks, etc.). The collected information allows you to improve the quality of implementation of the EP: analysis of similar EP in universities of Kazakhstan and abroad, studying the experience of leading universities, identifying priorities in the content of the EP, determining relevant academic disciplines with the possibility of their inclusion in the accredited EP.

### **Analytical part**

The university uses modern information systems, information and communication technologies and software tools for adequate information management. The institute's website functions: students can directly contact the university's management to resolve a conflict situation and get help in cases of corruption, as well as inform about the facts of corruption on the part of teaching staff and employees.

During the interview, students noted the opportunity to contact the management about solving certain problems related to the educational process. Also, the interview with the teaching staff showed that the management responds to suggestions and recommendations of interested parties.

During the EEC visit, it was found out that students, employees and teaching staff confirm their consent to the processing of personal data.

The degree of satisfaction of teaching staff is revealed during a survey on the organization of the educational process, the quality of information and material resources. For example, surveys of teaching staff and employees demonstrate their satisfaction with working conditions.

Satisfaction with the EP infrastructure is revealed through a survey of students, teaching staff, employees, and other interested parties. The survey demonstrates the satisfaction of students and teachers with the infrastructure of accredited educational institutions. The material, technical, library and information resources used to organize the learning process are sufficient and meet the requirements of the implemented educational programs. An information database has been created that functions within each structural division and allows you to quickly and flexibly solve production issues.

In general, the EEC notes that the university uses modern information systems, information

and communication technologies and software tools for adequate information management.

A survey of students showed that:

- information support and explanation of the admission rules and strategy of the educational program (specialty) before entering the university fully satisfy 79.8 %;
- informing the requirements for successfully completing a given educational program (specialty) - 80.3 %;
- informing students about courses, educational programs and academic degrees received – 79.8 %.

***The EP's strong point is:***

- satisfaction of students with the implementation of the EP and the quality of training at the university.

***Recommendations of the EEC for improving the quality of 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction:***

- to step up work on analyzing information in order to identify and predict risks from September 2023;
- regularly monitor and forecast potential risks for accredited programs, as well as the main trends of the EP in the regional, national and international context.

***EEC conclusions on criteria: According to the Standard "Information Management and reporting" 6B01702-Russian language and literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction have 1 strong position, 16 satisfactory positions and suggest improvement-0.***

### 7.3. Standard "Development and approval of the educational program"

#### ***Proof part***

Educational programs 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction are developed in accordance with the requirements of regulatory documents, National and industry qualifications frameworks, based on the analysis of the labor market and recommendations of employers. Educational programs are focused on learning outcomes and are built on a modular basis.

The procedure for developing educational programs in the areas of training implemented at институте им. the I. Altynsarin Institute is reflected in the internal regulatory document "Academic Policy", the Regulation on the educational program and the procedure for its development in the Arctic Research Institute:

The EP includes: the code and name of the EP, the code and classification of the field of education, the code and classification of the field of study, the level of qualification, the degree awarded, the general characteristics of the modular educational program; the catalog of elective subjects; the EMCD, syllabuses, the internship program, the program of state final certification, the development plan of the EP.

The EP consists of mandatory, elective, and professional practices. Elective subjects are reflected in the CED, which are developed annually. At the suggestion of teaching staff, employers, and students, new disciplines are introduced.

The EP reflects the expected learning outcomes determined on the basis of Dublin descriptors. The results of training are presented both in the entire program as a whole, and in modular levels. The expected learning outcomes are also reflected in syllabuses.

Students independently form an individual educational trajectory by registering for elective

subjects. At the same time, students are guided by the catalog of elective subjects.

The individual educational trajectory is reflected in individual curricula, where along with general education, basic disciplines of the mandatory component, there are practical and elective courses aimed at ensuring professional competencies.

In the course of the interview, students confirmed that consultations on the selection and implementation of an individual educational trajectory, the preparation of an EP, as well as other academic issues are carried out with the active help of advisors.

Monitoring, periodic review, and analysis of educational programs are carried out (internal and external audits, surveys of employers, students, and graduates, meeting quality goals, teaching and methodological work, research and development, report of the final state certification commission, analysis of graduates' employment, educational work, and conclusions of external experts), the results of which are presented in the annual report.

### ***Analytical part***

In general, the qualifications obtained as a result of the development of an educational program are clearly defined in accordance with a certain level of the National Framework of Qualifications in Higher Education and, consequently, the framework of qualifications in the European Higher Education Area: qualification level 6 – bachelor's degree.

The university has established the procedure for conducting external examinations of the EP. External expertise of the EP is carried out by teachers of the Russian language and literature of the city's schools, university teachers.

Towards the development of EP Teachers of the Russian language and literature of the I. Altynsarin gymnasium A. S. Yulmukhamedov, E. A. Sysoeva, I. A. Sitnova, teachers of the Russian language of the Keiki Batyr School No. 4 I. A. Seitgareva, and N.N.Amanbayeva were involved in the development of the OP 6B01702 – Russian language and Literature, 6B01705 – Russian Language and Literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction.

The Department cooperates with other universities, but there are no joint educational programs with foreign educational organizations, there is no work to harmonize the content of the EP with similar educational programs of Kazakhstani educational organizations.

Questionnaires on students' satisfaction with the quality of implementation of educational programs indicate that accredited educational institutions have a good basis for learning and good conditions for students to show their personal qualities during extracurricular hours. Overall, students rated the quality of the educational program at 82.5%.

### ***Strengths/best practices***

There are no strong points.

***Recommendations of the EEC for improving the quality of EP 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction:***

- determine the positions on two-degree educational programs with foreign universities for accredited educational programs until 2025;
- continue working on improving the structure of the EP: we need a clearer and more motivated logic for the formation of modules, the connection between modules and blocks of disciplines.

***EEC conclusions on criteria: according to the Standard "Development and approval of the educational program", the accredited educational programs 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction have 11 satisfactory positions and 1 position implies improvement.***

#### 7.4. Standard "Continuous monitoring and periodic evaluation of educational programs"

##### ***Proof part***

In order to continuously improve the EP, the university monitors them, which determines the achievement of goals and meeting the needs of students and stakeholders. The rules of monitoring, analysis and evaluation of educational programs are reflected in the "Regulation on the quality assessment of educational programs at the Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin"

The Dean of the Faculty and the heads of the EP are responsible for the processes of monitoring, evaluating and improving the EP.

Various monitoring methods are used to monitor and periodically evaluate the educational process: assessment of current academic performance of students, final certification, certification of all types of practices, checking the state of methodological support for the educational process, collecting and analyzing data on customer satisfaction.

Assessment успеваемости of students 'academic performance is determined by collecting and analyzing information about students' academic performance after the session. Students ' academic achievements are reflected in the "Platonus" system (<https://platon.api.edu.kz/>).

An important role for evaluating and improving the quality of educational programs is played by studying the requirements of consumers to the content of educational programs. Thus, at the end of internships, a survey of employers is conducted to determine their satisfaction with educational programs. The EP management presented the results of a survey of representatives of practice bases who note a good level of training of students.

##### ***Analytical part***

Continuous monitoring, periodic evaluation and revision of the Institute's educational programs are aimed at ensuring their effective implementation and creating a favorable learning environment for students.

In general, within the framework of monitoring and evaluating educational programs, the EP management demonstrated:

- students ' assessment of the pedagogical activity of the teaching staff involved in the implementation of the educational program after each academic period;
- a survey of graduates about the quality of the educational program, learning environment, and support services;
- questioning employers about the quality of training of students and graduates;
- analysis of the results of employment and career growth of graduates;
- organization of open classes and mutual visits of teaching staff.

The survey of students showed that 82.5% are completely satisfied with the quality of teaching , 17% are partially satisfied; 78.9% fully agree with the objectivity of the assessment of students ' achievements , and 21.1% partially agree.

##### ***Strengths/best practices***

No strengths were identified.

***Recommendations of the EEC for improving the quality of EP 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction:***

- update information on the Institute's website on changes made to the OP during the year;
- regularly analyze the labor market, types of employment, and the region's need for graduates, track job placement by specialty, and adjust the admission plans and content of the OP in this regard.

***EEC conclusions on criteria: according to the Standard "Continuous monitoring and periodic evaluation of educational programs", educational programs 6B01702-Russian language and literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction have 10 satisfactory positions and 0 positions suggest improvements.***

7.5. Standard "Student-centered learning, teaching and assessment of academic performance"

***Proof part***

ArkPI has created conditions for the development of student-centered learning:

- formation of clear goals and expected learning outcomes for students;
- implementation of active training methods;
- development of a person-centered approach;
- formation of an individual learning path;
- involvement of students in the development of educational programs;
- strengthening the role of independent work of students;
- application of a research approach in teaching;
- formation of a positive attitude towards students on the part of teachers.

Forms and methods of implementation of the EP encourage active involvement of students in the educational process and increase their independence and responsibility for the results of the educational process.

In teaching academic subjects of accredited educational institutions, the results of teaching staff's own research in the field of teaching methods are used. Special attention is paid to the modern approach to the discipline "Teaching methods" as the most important subject that forms the special competencies of a graduate of a pedagogical university.

Feedback from students in order to analyze the effectiveness of using certain pedagogical methods and organizing the educational process is carried out through their personal appeals to the management of the institute, faculty, department, through advisors and public student organizations. The Institute's website provides an opportunity for students to ask questions, which are answered by representatives of structural divisions.

In accordance with modern requirements, accredited educational programs provide for the possibility of building an individual educational trajectory, taking into account the personal needs and capabilities of students, including student-centered training at the university is provided through the choice of disciplines by students based on CED, which gives students the opportunity to make an alternative choice of elective academic disciplines.

Students are provided with a reference guide (<https://api.edu.kz/index.php/ru/obuchenie/2013-09-25-06-58-01>), containing the necessary information about the history of the university, credit technology of training, the system for monitoring and evaluating students' academic achievements, the rules for transferring and restoring students, tuition fees, etc.

The results of all types of control must be brought to the attention of students, including through information and communication technologies.

Students' achievements are reflected in the transcript. Students who have fulfilled the requirements of the curriculum and study programs in full are admitted to the final state certification.

When choosing elective subjects, determining the topics of theses (projects), choosing a research supervisor, and participating in research work, individual characteristics, needs, and cultural experience of students are taken into account.

The Institute has a student self-government, which involves students from among the activists who contribute to the search for more effective ways to solve managerial problems.

***Analytical part***

As a result of the visit, the EEC members confirm that the organization of the educational process at the Institute is carried out in accordance with the principles of student-centered training and is aimed at ensuring the quality of educational services, creating the necessary conditions for students.

Methods of implementing student-centered learning in the EP 6B01702 – Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction are introduced into the educational process in the form of active and interactive teaching methods that contribute to the activation of the educational process.

A survey of students conducted during the HEC visit showed that:

- fully satisfied with the training methods – 80.3 %,
- partially satisfied – 19.3 %;
- partially dissatisfied – 0.4 %.

***Strengths/best practices***

There are no strong points.

***Recommendations of the EEC for improving the quality of EP 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction:***

- include advanced training in the field of modern methods of evaluating learning outcomes in the department's work plan for the 2023-2024 academic year;
- take corrective actions to improve the implementation of the EP based on the results of feedback from students and assessment of their satisfaction.

***EEC conclusions on criteria: according to the Standard "Student-centered learning, teaching and assessment of academic performance", educational programs 6B01702-Russian language and literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction have 10 satisfactory positions and 0-suggests improvement.***

7.6. The "Learners" Standard

***Proof part***

The policy of forming a contingent of students includes career guidance work during the year, direct work of the university admissions committee during the summer period, and managing the movement of the contingent during training and graduation.

Working groups are being set up to travel to schools and colleges in the city or region. Explanatory work is organized among school graduates, "Open Days" are held, where meetings are held with schoolchildren, parents, teachers, where members of the admissions committee, teachers responsible for career guidance work, highlight issues and features of the formation of the student body, the rules for admission to the ArkPI, the list of documents, conditions of study and accommodation, specialized subjects, passing points, a list of preferential categories, etc.

An organizational week of adaptation and support for incoming students is organized at the Institute for 1st-year students: meetings are held with the dean and deputy deans for academic affairs on the issues and structure of the institute's socio-cultural life, the work of interest groups, creative and public organizations.

The results of the current certification are brought to the attention of students, discussed at meetings of the department, measures are taken to improve the quality of teaching classes and IWS, methodological and informational support for them. Elimination of academic debts is carried out on a paid basis during the summer semester, according to the approved academic calendar.

Special attention on the part of advisors and teaching staff of the department is paid to conducting educational activities with students. Planning of educational work at the department follows from the development program of the Institute. The plan sufficiently reflects the problems of educational work with students, the solutions of which are implemented at the department. Teaching staff of the department successfully combines teaching and research activities with cultural recreation, form and strengthen the students' civic position and sense of patriotism.

Employment of university graduates is determined by the "Regulation on measures to promote employment of graduates at the Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin"

***Analytical part***

EEC notes that targeted work is being carried out to increase the number of students participating in socio-political, cultural, mass and sports events of the Institute. Института Advisors organize meetings of first-year students with leading teachers of the department in order to get acquainted with the prospects and new directions in science. They also conduct individual work with lagging students, discuss current academic performance and attendance during adviser hours.

The Institute cooperates with domestic and foreign universities, but according to EP 6B01702 – Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature, schools with a non-Russian language do not implement work on external and internal academic mobility for students, as well as two-degree education.

The university indicates the functioning of the Alumni Association (the website provides information, Regulations, and work plan), but there is no confirmation of the effectiveness of the Association's work, and the information on the site is not updated.

Compliance of the procedures for assessing the level of knowledge of students with the planned learning outcomes and program goals is ensured by the functioning of a versatile assessment system, which includes various types of controls carried out both during the development of the discipline and during examination sessions, passing all types of professional practices, and final state certification. All the necessary information about the assessment procedure, including the conduct of intermediate certification in the form of an exam, current control, GPA score, is brought to students by posting information on the site, during adviser hours. The results of the current, milestone and final control are available to students on the educational portal of the Institute.

Interviews with students of the accredited EP revealed their satisfaction with the

educational process as a whole, as well as the possibility of extracurricular activities.

***Strengths/best practices***

No strengths were identified.

***Recommendations of the EEC for improving the quality of EP 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language:***

- to step up work on organizing external and internal academic mobility for students in the context of accredited educational programs from the 2023-2024 academic year;
- assist students in obtaining international grants (Russian World, Erasmus-Mundus, Bolashak, etc.), participation in socially significant republican, regional, city projects, as well as in international projects, conferences and international internships on a permanent basis;
- involve students more widely in applied joint scientific research and practice testing the results in the educational process from the 2023-2024 academic year;
- determine the parameters of support for gifted students 6B01702-Russian language and literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language, starting from the 2023-2024 academic year.

***EEC conclusions on criteria: according to the Standard "Students", educational programs 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language have 1 strong position, 9 satisfactory positions, and 2-suggest improvements.***

***7.7. Standard "Teaching staff"***

***Proof part***

The personnel policy of the Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin is reflected in the "Regulations on Personnel Policy", approved by the Academic Council of the Institute on 01.09.2021. "Regulations on Personnel policy" is publicly available on the university's website [Internal regulatory documents \(api.edu.kz\)](https://api.edu.kz)

The main provision of the HR policy is to build an effective system for forming a high-quality staff and teaching staff in the context of a constantly accelerating process of updating knowledge. Admission and dismissal of teaching staff at the Institute is carried out in accordance with the Labor Code of the Republic of Kazakhstan dated November 23, 2015 No. 414-V, the Regulation on personnel Policy of the ArkPI [https://api.edu.kz/images/files\\_institut/polozheniya\\_rus/Polozhenie\\_o\\_kadrovoy\\_politike.pdf](https://api.edu.kz/images/files_institut/polozheniya_rus/Polozhenie_o_kadrovoy_politike.pdf) from 01.09.2021.

Regulations on competitive replacement of positions of teaching staff and researchers, approved by the Board of Directors of NJSC Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin, approved on January 29, 2021, Protocol No. 1.

The management of the Institute at all levels is responsible for its employees and provides them with favorable working conditions. The university's activities in this area are reflected in the Charter of ArkPI, in the collective agreement of employees, and in the remuneration system. The concept of favorable working conditions includes both material and non-material conditions. Material conditions include providing employees with places of work that are equipped with the necessary equipment, as well as providing educational and scientific literature. ArkPI conducts systematic work to improve the material and technical working conditions of teachers. The Institute has a material and technical base that allows conducting all types of teaching and

research work of teaching staff. Non-material favorable working conditions include the psychological climate that has developed in the departments that implement EP. A favorable psychological climate is determined by the peculiarities of the distribution of the educational load, taking into account the scientific interests of each teacher implementing the EP, and the adequate distribution of public assignments.

The Commission was presented with the qualitative and quantitative composition of the teaching staff involved in the implementation of accredited programs, planning the teaching staff load, monitoring the quality of teaching, monitoring the implementation of the individual teaching staff plan, and the policy of forming the staff of the teaching staff.

In the 2022-2023 academic year, the faculty consists of 12 teachers, including 4 masters of a sciences, 7 senior teachers.

Scientific and methodological activities of teaching staff are represented by monographs, teaching aids, publications in journals, materials of national and international conferences.

Professional development of teaching staff is carried out through short-term courses, seminars, internships in universities of Kazakhstan and neighboring countries.

For example, since August 2021, Nursali K. S. has been taking advanced training courses in the project of the Ministry of Education and Science of the Republic of Kazakhstan and the World Bank "Strengthening the potential of teacher education" within the framework of the project "Modernisation of Secondary Education".

From March 10 to 19, 2021, Nursali K. S. passed the Academic Leadership Program advanced training course organized by NARKHOZ University. Teachers conduct classes using a

multimedia complex, case technologies, group work, interactive methods, and the project method. To increase students' interest in educational and cognitive activities, new material is supplemented with Flash presentations made using the following editors: CamStudio, FreemakeVideoConverter, and SpringFree (test task editor).

Young teachers have the opportunity to improve their scientific potential. The Department supports them in this by organizing scientific and methodological seminars, master classes, and open classes. The department conducts mentoring work: young specialists are assigned to experienced teachers.

### ***Analytical part***

EEC IAAR notes that the university ensures the completeness and adequacy of individual planning of the work of teaching staff in all types of activities, monitoring the effectiveness and effectiveness of individual plans. The teaching load of teachers consists of educational, teaching-methodical, research, educational activities, which are planned for one academic year.

Teachers strive for efficiency in their work, which contributes to the achievement of certain results for each employee and the university as a whole. The Institute has adopted such moral and material forms of encouragement as awarding commendatory, honorary certificates, and valuable gifts.

In 2021, Associate Professor Z. Koldasbayeva was awarded the Jubilee Medal "65 years of Arkalyk" for her contribution to the development and formation of Arkalyk. In 2022, in honor of the 50th anniversary of the founding of the Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin, she was awarded the Jubilee Medal "50 years since the foundation of the Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin", the medal "For contribution to the development of education" No. 0296, May 17, 2021.

Senior lecturer G. S. Zhumabayeva received a Letter of Gratitude from the Ministry of Education and Science for her contribution to the training of young specialists in the higher education system. In 2022, Nursali K. S. was awarded a Letter of Thanks from the Chairman of the Board – Rector in honor of the 50th anniversary of the founding of the Arkalyk Pedagogical Institute named after I. Altynsarin.

CCPs actively participate in the public life of the region. Teaching staff of the EP regularly conducts seminars with teachers of schools and colleges in Arkalyk, where they introduce their own methodological experience.

To the International Encyclopedia "Best People. Best in education" includes materials on the scientific activities of Associate Professor Koldasbayev Z. Sh. Nursali K. S. entered the "Golden Book of Youth of the city of Arkalyk" in the "Young Scientist" nomination.

It is necessary to note the insufficient level of involvement of practitioners from the relevant industries in teaching.

There is no active participation of teaching staff in competitions for grant funding.

There is insufficient information about teachers on the Institute's website, and there is practically no academic mobility of teaching staff.

The results of scientific activity of teachers do not have a sufficiently high level of publication activity. A small number of scientific publications are published in journals recommended by the CCFES of the Ministry of Education and Science of the Republic of Kazakhstan, and rating journals. At the same time, experts noted that the EP management is aware of the responsibility for its employees and creates favorable working conditions for them on the basis of interviewing teaching staff.

The results of the survey of teaching staff showed that 42.4 % of respondents believe that the university provides very good opportunities for professional development of teaching staff, good-51.5 %, relatively bad-3 %, bad-3 %. In general, the teaching staff gave a positive assessment of the university and expressed overall satisfaction with the production processes.

### ***Strengths/best practices***

Strengths of the accredited EP were not identified.



***Recommendations of the EEC for improving the quality of EP 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language:***

- practice inviting leading domestic and foreign scientists to give lectures on accredited programs, starting from the 2023-2024 academic year;

When carrying out educational activities, ArkPI is guided by regulatory documents regulating mandatory regulatory requirements for the material and technical, educational and laboratory facilities of educational organizations. The university has a material and technical base, that provides проведение all types of practical training and research work for teaching staff and students, provided for in the curriculum of the university and corresponding to the current sanitary-epidemiological and fire -fighting norms and rules.

The Institute's infrastructure includes: 2 academic buildings, 2 public buildings, a sports and recreation complex, an information and library complex, музей им. the I. Altynsarin Museum and the Natural History Museum.

По Accredited educational institutions have teaching rooms, lecture halls, equipped with computer equipment, interactive whiteboards, audio-video equipment, multimedia projectors, software products (10 computer classes, mobile computer classes, 3 electronic reading rooms in the IBC, 2 language rooms, 22 specialized rooms, 7 training workshops, видеоконференца video conferencing systemсвязи Polycom VSX 7000).

In general, classrooms meet the sanitary and hygienic standards required for university classrooms. The organization of EP training sessions is provided with a sufficient classroom fund. The total training area used corresponds to the regulatory indicators, standards of the sanitary and fire service.

The university is equipped withоф системой television video surveillance systemсоф, warning systems, access control systems (access control cards), buildings of academic buildings, dormitories are equipped with automatic fire alarms.

8 classrooms are allocated for the educational process of accredited educational programs: 1 specialized classroom equipped with a Multimedia projector (326); classrooms (302, 326, 328); lecture halls (205, 407, 312, 313, 505).

ArkPI has an ICL: reading rooms, an electronic resource center, and a media center with a video room. The information and communication corporate network includes 362 computers, all of which have access to the Internet. The total area of ICL ArkPI is 627.2 sq. m., book depository-108.7 sq. m., subscription-151.9 sq. m.

The Institute fully supports students with special educational needs (ramps, tactile markings for the visually impaired).

For the implementation of educational activities, the official website of the Institute operates in three languages <https://api.edu.kz/index.php/ru/>. The website provides basic information about the university's activities and the EP, as well as links to the main information systems and resources.

#### **Analytical part**

During the EEC visit, it was determined that the Institute has its own infrastructure, which ensures its optimal functioning in many areas.

The university has created structural divisions that assist students in mastering the EP. Appointed advisors from the faculty of the department, who hold the position of academic mentor of the student in accredited educational programs. They facilitate the choice of an educational trajectory and the development of EP during the training period. For academic support, students are provided with information, reference and methodological materials.

Library resources, including the collection of educational, methodical and scientific literature on general education, basic and profile disciplines are presented on paper and electronic media.

There is open access to scientific databases.

On the territory of the university there is a WI-FI system and a corporate network.

Within the university, we can trace the existence of support procedures for various groups of students, including information and counseling.

The library's book collection consists of 288,114 copies of paper publications, including 62537 scientific publications, 78,012 educational publications–, and 66871 teaching materials.– 66871 экз.

The Commission notes that во all buildings of the Institute and dormitories работают зоны have WI-FI zones.

The results of the survey of students showed:

- 68.6% are fully satisfied with the availability of computer classes 68,6, 22.9% are partially satisfied, 7.2% are partially dissatisfied, and 0.9% are not satisfied.

- 82.1% are fully satisfied with the quality of services provided in libraries and reading rooms, and 14.8% are partially satisfied.

-71.7% are fully satisfied with the availability and quality of Internet resources полностью удовлетворены, 21.1% are partially satisfied, 4.9% are partially dissatisfied, and 1.3% are not satisfied.

#### ***Strengths/best practices***

- the university demonstrates that library resources, including the collection of educational, methodological and scientific literature on general education, basic and profile disciplines on paper and electronic media, periodicals, access to scientific databases meet the needs of the implemented EP 6B01702-Russian language and literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language.

The EEC confirms that the provision of academic and methodological literature, both on digital media and printed materials, is 100% provided to the disciplines accredited by the EP by the library fund.

#### ***Recommendations of the EEC for improving the quality of EP 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction:***

- develop a work plan for attracting sponsors to strengthen the material and technical base of accredited EP until 2024;

- it is important for the university management to provide favorable conditions for conducting scientific research, integrating science and education, and publishing the results of research work of teaching staff, employees and students on an ongoing basis;

- update an effective support system for various groups and categories of students.

***EEC conclusions on criteria: according to the Standard "Educational resources and student support systems", educational programs 6B01702-Russian language and Literature, 6B01705-Russian language and literature in schools with a non-Russian language of instruction have 1 strong position, 11 satisfactory positions, and 1-implies improvement.***
